## 2009 Lee County 4-H

### Regulations:

1. The 4-H Office reserves the right to reject exhibits that do not meet quality standards or listed requirements.
2. The exhibitor must be enrolled in a 4-H project or learning activity through the Lee County 4-H Office.
3. All exhibits must have been constructed or prepared by the exhibitor since October of last year and/or never entered as an exhibit in the fair.
4. All exhibits must be entered at owner's risk. Every article on exhibition shall be under the control of the Fair management. While every precaution will be taken to safeguard the same, neither the management nor workers will be responsible for any loss, damage or accident that may occur. Janitorial people will be in and out of the building throughout the day and night, and will be alert to the exhibits.
5. The decision of the judges is final and no appeal will be considered.
6. Exhibits will be received Tuesday September 22, from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. No exhibits may be removed until Tuesday, October 6 from 3:30 to 5:30 p.m. Anyone who cannot be there at that time will need to make prior arrangements with the 4-H Office.
7. Each exhibit will be classified as blue, red or white if it is of the quality that merits a ribbon. Cash awards will be paid on blue ribbons (\$5.00), red ribbons (\$3.00) and white (\$1.00) ribbons. No premium will be paid for disqualified exhibits.
8. **You must PRE-REGISTER by obtaining an exhibitor number and picking up entry tags at the 4-H Office by Thursday, September 17.** All exhibits must be identified with tags securely attached.
9. Blue ribbon exhibits will be displayed. Red and white ribbon exhibits will be displayed only if space is available. **Items exhibited at previous North MS Fairs and items not made by the 4-H'er will be disqualified and no premium will be paid.**

Special Note: The Clover Shop is open to all Cloverbud exhibitors ages 5 to 7.

### 4-H Club Booth

4-H Clubs may enter a tri-fold exhibit promoting one or more 4-H projects which may include Leadership, Citizenship (Congressional Award), Communication Skills, Shooting Sports/Field & Stream, or Animals. The exhibit should show young people what 4-H has to offer in these areas. The width of the exhibit should be about the size of a card table.

The following awards will be presented to qualified booths; first - \$100, second - \$75, third - \$50.

## Division – Clover Shop (Ages 5 to 7)

Premiums – Blue - \$5.00, Red - \$3.00, White - \$1.00

Cloverleaf exhibitors are allowed to enter a maximum of 20 exhibits from the list below.

### CLASS 1

**Lot:**

1. Cloverleaf exhibit (three paneled display) or Project poster (½ educational poster related to a 4-H project)
2. Project bookmark—bookmark depicting a 4-H project
3. Gift item
4. Refrigerator magnet
5. Paper craft—item made of paper, such as origami
6. Decorated shirt, shoes or hat
7. Drawing
8. Painting
9. Puppet
10. Wooden item (decorated)
11. Creative item
12. Trash to treasure—recycled item
13. Photography (must be framed and able to stand alone)
14. Decorated picture frame
15. Mother's Day/ Father's Day item
16. Seasonal decoration (any holiday)
17. Christmas ornament
18. Collection (minimum of 8 items, labeled and or neatly displayed in container)
19. Handmade accessory—barrette, purse, scarf, etc.

## Youth – Ages 8-18 (as of January 1)

### Division – Animal Science

One item from each of the following may be entered

### CLASS 2

**Lot:**

1. Pet Care Kit
2. Animal Grooming Kit
3. Beef, Sheep, Swine, Dairy or Goat poster - 22"x28"
4. Halter/ Neck or Lead Rope (must be made or decorated by the 4-H'er)

## Division – Field Crops/Gardening

One item from each of the following may be entered

### CLASS 3

**Lot:**

1. Decorated pumpkin, watermelon or gourd
2. Seed I.D. Flash Cards or Notebook (10-juniors, 15–seniors) – **Must be actual seeds – not pictures-**  
Seeds must be secured to cards or heavy paper and properly labeled

## Division – Home Environment

A total of twelve items may be entered in this division.

## Division – Holiday Shop

One item from each of the following may be entered.

### CLASS 6

**Lot:**

1. Christmas Ornament—made by 4-Her
2. Christmas Tree Skirt
3. Christmas Table Decoration
4. Christmas Door Decoration
5. Wall Hanging
6. Other Seasonal Decoration (not Christmas)
7. Gift Item – item made by the 4-H'er to be given as a gift

## Division – Wildlife/Conservation

One item from each of the following may be entered.

### CLASS 7

**Lot:**

1. Birdhouse—must be handmade by 4-Her (functional, not decorative)
2. Wildlife Notebook/Flash Cards - foods identified and matched with animals who eat them (10-juniors, 15-seniors)
3. Bird/Squirrel Feeder—must be handmade by the 4-Her (functional, not decorative)
4. Duck or Squirrel Box—must be handmade by the 4-Her (functional, not decorative)
5. Nature craft
6. Leaf Collection - leaves are to be pressed, dried and mounted on Extension leaf mounting cards or cardstock paper; covered with clear contact paper; list date collected on card (10-juniors, 15-seniors)
7. Recycled Item – An item made to be used for something other than its intended use  
Example: plastic bottle bird feeder

## Division – Visual Arts

A total of five items may be entered in this division.

**Art entered with exception of sculpture and dimensional paper art, must be framed, matted, shrink wrapped or be presented on canvas.**

### CLASS 8

**Lot:**

1. Mixed Media (two or more) - oil, pastel, fabric, crayon
2. Watercolor
3. Collage
4. Acrylic
5. Paper Art (origami)
6. Pencil/Charcoal
7. Sculpture

## Division – Photography

One item from each of the following may be entered.

**Photos must be framed and able to stand alone or will be disqualified. All photos must be taken by the 4-H'er.**

### CLASS 9

**Lot:**

1. 5" x 7" or 8" x 10" (color)
2. 5" x 7" or 8" x 10" (black/white)
3. 5" x 7" or 8" x 10" (sepia)
4. Landscape
5. Action
6. Animal
7. Portrait (people)
8. Computer enhanced photograph or composite

## Division – Clothing

### CLASS 10 – SEWING PROJECTS

One item from each of the following may be entered.

All items must be sewn by the 4-H'er -- not purchased and decorated.

**Lot:**

1. Simple Dress or Jumper
2. Apron or Other Simple Project
3. Shorts, Skirt or Vest
4. Shirt, Blouse or Top
5. Accessory (handmade purse, belt, etc.)
6. Advanced Outfit (difficult dress, suit, etc)
7. Pillow
8. Laundry Bag
9. Home item, such as pillow case, travel caddy, blanket, or quilt

### CLASS 11– CLOTHING – OTHER

One item from each of the following may be entered.

**Lot:**

1. Notebook/Flash Cards - fabrics, uses and care requirements or latest styles and fads (5-juniors, 10-seniors)
2. Handmade jewelry (necklace, earrings, bracelet)
3. Decorated shirt
4. Decorated accessory (shoes, purse, belt)

## Division – 4-H

One item from each of the following may be entered

### CLASS 12

**Lot:**

1. 4-H Project File (notebook or file box)/Cloverleaf Exhibit - tri-fold or poster (8-9 yr. olds.)
2. Essay – Why I Love 4-H or My Favorite Memories of 4-H (400-700 words, double spaced and typed, if possible) or 4-H Scrapbook
3. Poem – related to 4-H
4. 4-H Poster Art Poster (1/2 poster size, 4-H theme)
5. Craft using 4-H clover
6. 4-H Project Bookmark
7. Recipe Box or Notebook Juniors-10, seniors-15 (typed or hand written by the 4-H member)

9. Computer generated graphic or other project relating to the 4-H Computer Project
