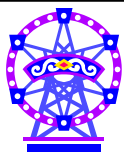

Horse Show

New for 2009! This year, the county horse show will be held the Saturday before the week of the County Fair. The horse show will be held on **Saturday, September 12, beginning at 10:00 a.m.** Horses must be **checked in between 8:00 a.m. and 9:30 a.m. that morning.** Papers will be checked, and entry forms will be completed during these times. You do not need to pre-register.

You won't want to miss the horse show this year! It was a **HUGE** success last year, as we had outstanding participation! There will be events for **ALL** riders! You can pick from halter classes, performance classes, and timed events classes. There will be halter classes, hunter under saddle, hunt seat equitation, equitation over fences,

gaited pleasure, western pleasure, western horsemanship, ribbon pull, arena race, mounted or unmounted goat tying, 3D barrel racing, 3D pole bending, and 3D stake race. Begin making plans to participate. You can pick up a copy of the rules, the patterns, and a list of classes at the Extension Office.

Make sure you have a **CURRENT negative Coggins test** on each horse you plan to exhibit. Also, be sure to bring your **registration papers** for your **registered horses!**



Livestock Show



As in the past, our county livestock show will be held during the week of the County Fair. The **beef/dairy goat show** will be held on the **Wednesday** night of the week, **September 16, beginning at 5:00 p.m.**, and the **dairy cattle show** will be held on the **Thursday** night of the week, **September 17, beginning at 5:00 p.m.** Livestock must be **checked in on Tuesday, September 15, from 3:00-8:00 p.m.**

I will be entering the entries turned in on the colored forms in the county livestock show. There is no need for additional paperwork **UNLESS** you have additional animals that you will **NOT** be showing at the State Fair. Please enter these animals on 195 forms. Also, if there are younger exhibitors not participating in the State Fair but would like to show an animal in the county livestock show or participate in pee-wee showmanship, please make these entries on a 195 form as well. **I will need ALL additional entries by Friday, September 11.**
