- immunizations, well child care, limited dental care**

**Physicians’ Care—inpatient services, outpatient surgery, related tests, home
- and office visits, medical emergency care**

- Chiropractic Care

- Maternity Care

- Prescription Drugs

- Hospital/Facility Care—inpatient and outpatient services

- Physical, Occupational, and Speech Therapy

**Mental Health and Substance Abuse—inpatient and outpatient facility and
- professional care**
