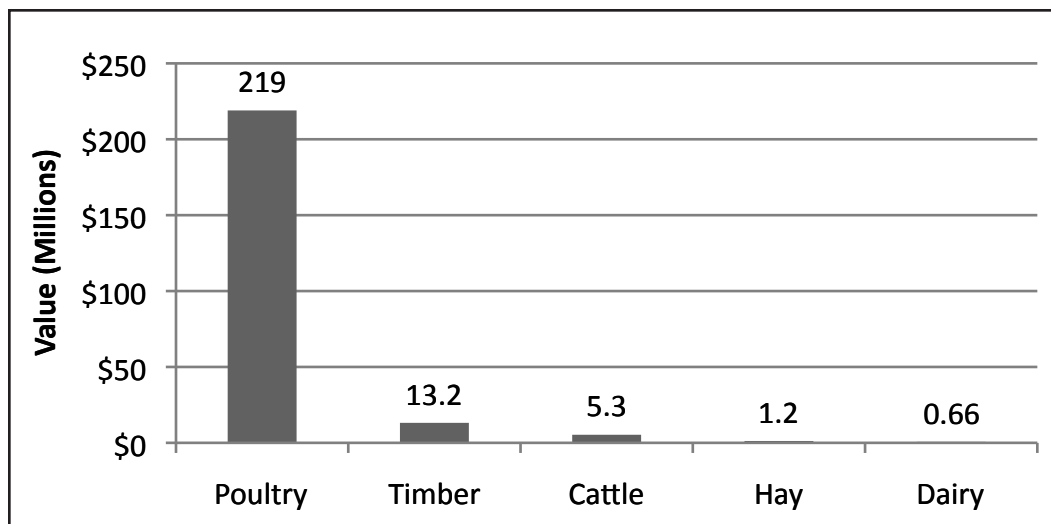
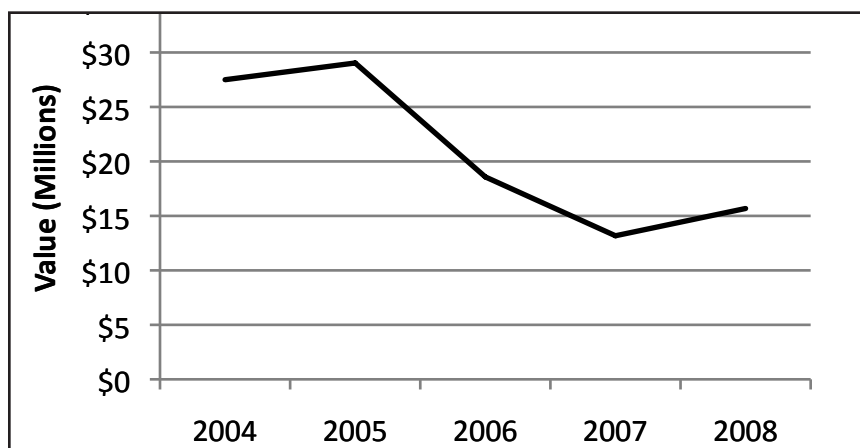


TIMBER: An Important Crop in Neshoba County

Timber Values over Time

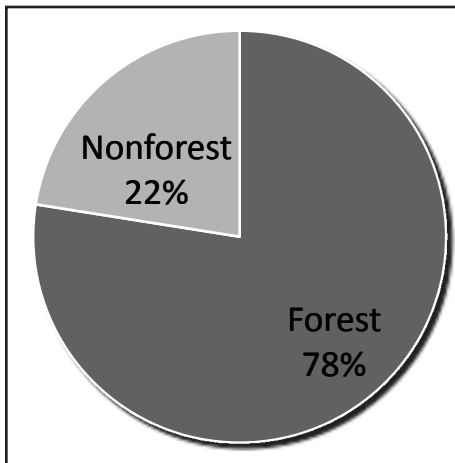
Benefits of Actively Managing Your Forest Land

- Sound forest management protects soil and water resources.

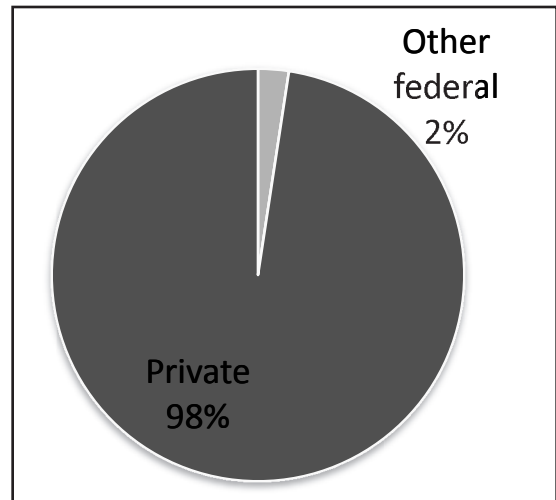

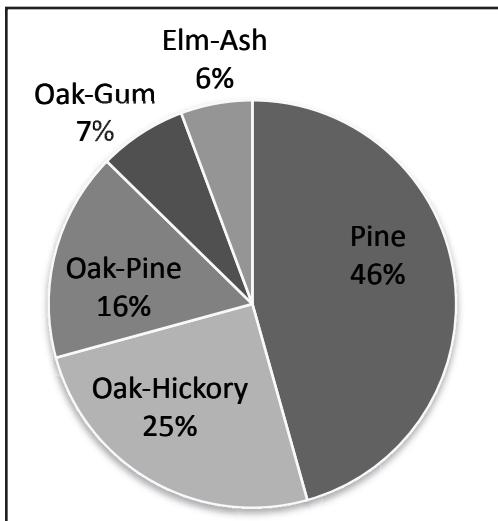


Total Area (385,208 acres)
